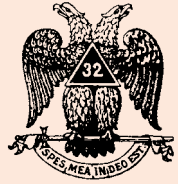

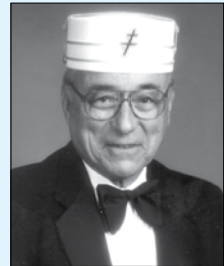

As my friend eagerly studies his prophecies toward his “passing” and “raising” he wonders if his son will follow in his Masonic footsteps he named him ”Mason.” when he was born five years ago. ## *From Adan Bautista*

Recently, I traveled by train from Sacramento to Reno in the California Zephyr with one of my cousins. This trip offers both unique views of the Sierra Nevada and some history lessons narrated by a volunteer about the construction of the railroad and the different cities that we passed by along the way. I've always liked to have an idea of what to expect when I travel to a new place, so days before I left for my trip, I had already researched as much as I could about it. However, on my way back from Reno I had a very pleasant surprise that I almost missed.

The night before we returned, on January 6th, I was checking that my tickets were ready, but I noticed that they were dated for February 7th instead. I immediately called Amtrak and the customer service person said that they didn't have any space left in the train to Sacramento so my cousin and I returned by bus.

When we got to the town of Colfax, CA the bus stopped at the local chamber of commerce/museum. The building has two rooms, one is the museum and the other one has snacks, drinks and rest rooms. A very nice older gentleman and his wife are the caretakers. On my way out I asked him if Colfax had a Ma-



sonic lodge. He hesitated a little, but his wife was prompt to answer. She said, "Yes, there is one just a couple blocks from here, and actually his father (pointing to her husband) was a Mason." Then she directed me to a small table that is at the entrance of the museum room and where they had several items that a Lodge and some other people had donated to them for exhibition.

The Masonic Lamb Skin apron seen in the picture belonged to Brother Cleetis Lloyd Brown who became a Master Mason in Tyrian Lodge # 439 in Manteca, California around 1928. In those days the Brothers carried their aprons from place to place to attend any Lodge that they encountered when traveling. It is said that even Brother George Washington carried his Masonic apron everywhere he went.

Regarding the Lodge in Colfax, its proper name is Illinoistown Lodge No. 51 F&AM. This Lodge was chartered in 1854 according to their own web page, and they first met in a small building in the original Old Town of Illinoistown. Having outgrown the original hall the Lodge moved to the new town of Colfax where they began to build a new hall in 1867. The Lodge officially moved into the hall on December 7, 1867 and the hall was dedicated on June 24, 1868.

I know that my cousin didn't really understand my excitement when I saw all those Masonic objects in the museum. What I can say is, I felt privileged to have found a connection with people, Masonic brothers, that in the present as well as in the past have been part of the history of our state of California, and I found it unexpectedly.

It was not until a great leader from one side, **Justamynuta** (Just - a - my- nuuu- ta) **Mylarian**, a great-great grandson, a man of stature, good character, well educated and renowned for his honesty decided to bring to an end the destruction of both families. Besides, he had fallen in love with one of **Jelnoskies** daughters - after meeting her while hunting wild game in the Valley of **Skymalar** near her village. He had bagged a huge Bull Elk and needed help getting it out of the brush. **Wilmona**, **Jelnoskies** cute young daughter, dismounted from her trusty steed and together they were able to cut the animal in quarters and load it on their horses. In honor of her great deed, he held a huge party inviting all the members of both families to his "Mustang River Ranch". A huge hind quarter was roasted for the affair and after several years, when beef cattle were plentiful, their hind quarters became the main slice of meat for roasting. The menu included mashed potatoes and gravy, corn and of course a nice green field salad. Usually a cherry dump cake was prepared by the ladies for dessert which is still popular today.



Footnote: **Wilmona** and **Justamynuta** were married, the families stopped feuding, and because they held a feast like this frequently they were responsible for starting the BBQ craze that is fashionable today.

## The Origins of the Scottish Rite

Like so much early Masonic history, the origins of the Scottish Rite are hidden in mist. There's evidence that by the early 1730s in England there were "Scotch Masons" or "Scots Master Masons," a step after the Master Mason Degree (and apparently unrelated to Scotland). By 1742 in Berlin there was talk of "higher or so-called Scottish Masonry." In 1743 the Grand Lodge of France adopted a regulation limiting the privileges of "Scots Masters" in lodges. It's clear from these few mentions that something was going on behind the scenes with "Scottish Masonry," but we're not quite sure what. These developments were happening at the same time the Royal Arch was gestating before its birth in 1754. It's even possible that the Royal Arch and Scottish Masonry came from the same sources. We just don't know.

What we do know is that the *high degrees* found fertile ground when they were introduced to French Masonry. In 1745, two years after restricting Scotch Masons, the Grand Lodge of France gave them special privileges, and more privileges and authority followed in 1747 and 1755. In contrast, the Royal Arch appears in lodge minutes in America in 1753 and England in 1758 with little official notice. By 1766 we know that an elaborate sequence of High Degree or "Scottish" Masonry is being worked in France. There's much activity prior to 1766 that we'll cover later, but we want to take a look now at that sequence of High Degrees.

### **Emperors and Knights in France**

Competition is the force that drives the world's economies, and it also seems to have driven Scottish Masonry in France, which became part of jockeying for power within the Grand Lodge of France. The Council of the Knights of the East, Sovereign Prince Masons, was organized in 1756, and included in its government middle-class Masons who had been excluded in previous High Degree ventures. It is not known how many degrees the Knights worked, but they seem to have faded out around 1768–1779.

Coming on the heels of the Knights of the East in 1758 was the Sovereign Council of Emperors of the East and of the West, Sublime Scottish Mother Lodge. The Emperors attracted the upper class and nobility and competed with the knights in the number of degrees they offered. (Just from a marketing point of view the newer group bested the older: "Emperors" are more powerful than "Knights," and "East and West" is twice as extensive as only "East.")
