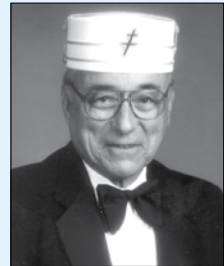

When entering a Chapter or Lodge Room, remember that your phone does have an off button. There are very, very few things in the world that absolutely cannot wait. It also has a Silent Mode, Use one or the other.

Things to keep in mind when texting or emailing:

Be aware of your tone. It is extremely difficult to discern tone in text messages, just as in e-mail. What seems to you to be a completely innocuous message may be grossly misinterpreted by the recipient, causing certain discomfort if not irreparable harm.

## SCOTTISH RITE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Over the last few years the Fresno Scottish Rite bodies has sponsored several annual scholarships for deserving students at the Center for Advanced Research and Technology (CART) High School program here in the Fresno community. The program has helped many college bound students with financial aid for their first year of college. As a national model for high school reform, CART is the largest education reform project of its kind in the country. The support given to this program continues to be an effort that ever member of the Fresno Scottish Rite can take justifiable pride in. If it were not for the support of all of

At the same time our state Scottish Rite Foundation has had a larger program that perhaps not all of our local members are familiar with. ## The Origins of the Scottish Rite

Like so much early Masonic history, the origins of the Scottish Rite are hidden in mist. There's evidence that by the early 1730s in England there were "Scotch Masons" or "Scots Master Masons," a step after the Master Mason Degree (and apparently unrelated to Scotland). By 1742 in Berlin there was talk of "higher or so-called Scottish Masonry." In 1743 the Grand Lodge of France adopted a regulation limiting the privileges of "Scots Masters" in lodges. It's clear from these few mentions that something was going on behind the scenes with "Scottish Masonry," but we're not quite sure what. These developments were happening at the same time the Royal Arch was gestating before its birth in 1754. It's even possible that the Royal Arch and Scottish Masonry came from the same sources. We just don't know.

What we do know is that the high degrees found fertile ground when they were introduced to French Masonry. In 1745, two years after restricting Scotch Masons, the Grand Lodge of France gave them special privileges, and more privileges and authority followed in 1747 and 1755. In contrast, the Royal Arch appears in lodge minutes in America in 1753 and England in 1758 with little official notice. By 1766 we know that an elaborate sequence of High Degree or "Scottish" Masonry is being worked in France. There's much activity prior to 1766 that we'll cover later, but we want to take a look now at that sequence of High Degrees.

### Emperors and Knights in France

Competition is the force that drives the world's economies, and it also seems to have driven Scottish Masonry in France, which became part of jockeying for power within the Grand Lodge of France. The Council of the Knights of the East, Sovereign Prince Masons, was organized in 1756, and included in its government middle-class Masons who had been excluded in previous High Degree ventures. It is not known how many degrees the Knights worked, but they seem to have faded out around 1768–1779.

Coming on the heels of the Knights of the East in 1758 was the Sovereign Council of Emperors of the East and of the West, Sublime Scottish Mother Lodge. The Emperors attracted the upper class and nobility and competed with the knights in the number of degrees they offered. (Just from a marketing point of view the newer group bested the older: "Emperors" are more powerful than "Knights," and "East and West" is twice as extensive as only "East.") offered. ## ASTROLOGY

During this past April I spent nearly two weeks touring our Nation's Capital with a special eye for its symbolisms revealed in its beautiful edifices, monuments and even in its art galleries. It was a wonderful experience as I was prepared to check out nearly all the zodiacal signs within the Federal City.

From the very beginning until recent time Freemasons from Pierre Charles L'Enfant to James McMillan and even the 1950's Masonic architects and sculptures played a very important role in planning and designing this city. Therefore, it is no

chance that Washington, D.C. contains more zodiacal signs than any other city in the world.

One of the most important DNA components of Freemasonry is Astrology. It is the oldest science known to man, predating all historical records. Astronomy and Astrology were one and the same until very recently in man's history.

Contrary to popular belief Astrology is not the telling of fortunes or making any claims that one can predict the future. Nor does it deny the free will of man. In fact, it emphasizes man's free will by asserting that each person determines his own fate by the manner in which he conducts his life and by the principles which he adopts and lives by.

Unfortunately, over time Astrology has been corrupted by newspapers listing daily "horoscopes" telling one's fortunes.

Astrology and Freemasonry teach a similar philosophy:

Seeks to reveal the principles of one's inner nature – one's spiritual being.

Taking good men and making them better.

Both stress the ancient dictum to "Know Thyself."

Both teach the concept of balancing one's life. For example Freemasonry teaches the concept of balance and harmony. So does Astrology in the zodiac Sign Libra.

Both teach about cycles and their relationship to the affairs of man. Examples are day – night, 4 seasons, days, weeks and months.

Astrological Symbolism is present in nearly all of the Masonic Degrees from the Entered Apprentice to the 32nd Degree.

Some people reject astrology because they take it literally by rejecting the notion that the planets symbolically are spiritual beings (angels). By taking allegorical stories and interpreting them literally is corrupting the real lesson(s) to be learned.
